Eileen Glass

Founding member of L'Arche in Australia, a Spiritual Director, Educator and Supervisor of Spiritual Directors

Eileen leads retreats for L'Arche International as well as for groups outside L'Arche. For many years Eileen coordinated the communities of L'Arche in India, Japan, the Philippines, Australia and New Zealand. She has considerable experience of working in cross-cultural and inter-religious contexts.

Venerable Thích Thông Pháp

Venerable Thích Thông Pháp is a Buddhist monk ordained in the Bamboo Forest Zen tradition of Vietnam.

Thay has been living in Tasmania since June 2010, doing a PhD, training towards CPE supervision, working in student pastoral care at Calvary Hospital and chaplain at the Whittle Palliative Care Unit and as a volunteer with Hospice Volunteers Association of Southern Tasmania. Currently he is the volunteer project officer with Spiritual Care Australia, Tasmania branch. Prior to coming to Tasmania, he worked for four years at Flinders University, SA, as the Buddhist chaplain within a multi-faith chaplaincy. His chief interest in human spirituality is the relationship between spiritual practice and an engagement with peace and justice in the world, the development of dialogue particularly between Buddhism and Christianity and his dual vocation to the contemplative life and to pastoral care.

Rabbi Paul J Jacobson

Rabbi Paul J Jacobson was born in Red Bank, New Jersey and graduated from Washington University in St Louis.

Paul enrolled in Hebrew Union College – Jewish Institute of Religion rabbinical school, spending his first year in Jerusalem and subsequent years on the Cincinnati campus. Since arriving in Sydney in July 2006, he has participated in all aspects of congregational life and in February 2009 was selected as a participant for the International Nahum Goldmann Fellowship, a programme for young leaders. As a complement to his work with the Jewish community, Rabbi Jacobson is active in interfaith dialogue, and regularly participates on panel discussions with representatives of other faiths. He is currently becoming accredited as a chaplain through the New South Wales Disaster Recovery Network.
